An EasyRead Guide to Eligibility Criteria









Essex County Council has written this document to help you understand the **eligibility criteria** for social care services.

Eligibility criteria are a set of guidelines that help us decide if you can receive social care services.



In Essex we assess your care and support needs using the eligibility criteria set out in the Care Act 2014.



In your assessment we will find out:

- what your care needs are
- what support you need
- who should give you that support.



To receive a social care service you must meet all 3 of the eligibility criteria below.



1. Your needs must be because you have:



a physical disability



• learning disabilities



mental health illness



2. You must be unable to do 2 or more of the things listed below:





• To choose and prepare your food.



• To keep yourself clean.



• To use the toilet on your own.



• To get dressed.



• To be safe at home.




• To keep your home clean.



• To make and maintain relationships.



• To go to work or college.



• To access community services.



• To look after your child, if you have one.



3. Your wellbeing is affected



Wellbeing means that you are happy, healthy and safe.



The Care Act says that protecting your wellbeing means:



• you are treated with respect



you feel happy and healthy



 you are in control of your day to day life



• you are protected from abuse



• you can go to work or college



• you can take part in activities



you can make and keep relationships



 you have enough money for the things you need



• your home is right for your needs



• you are part of your community

Carer Eligibility Criteria



If you are a carer you may be able to get support from social care services.

We will look at the following:



1. You need support because you give care to an adult.



2. Your health and wellbeing is at risk because of your caring role, or if you can't do 1 of the following:



• look after your child or family



• keep your home clean



• choose and prepare food



make and keep relationships



• go to work or college



• take part in community life



take part in activities



3. Your health and wellbeing suffers because you can't do these things.
